

PREAMBLE

Club Committees and Triallists

The Executive have established a training program to prepare young dogs for competition.

We believe that a basic graded system of voluntary, training sessions will give competitors the tools to achieve at a novice level, and the motivation to stay in the sport and attempt higher levels with success.

This is available to clubs to take this on and be responsible for training, mentoring and assessment of those who participate.

The following graded system of training is based on a similar UK qualification that has been going since 2006.

We have established a qualification based on these grades that competitors can attach to their dog's pedigree – like what the NZKC Obedience and Agility have at present.

The qualifications will be:

- Novice Beginner Bronze (beginner trial dog grade 1)
- Novice Beginner Silver (beginner trial dog grade 2)
- Novice Beginner Gold (beginner trial dog grade 3)

Triallist may train their dogs themselves, train at their local Gundog club or even join an Obedience club.

Competitors must be assessed by assessors of suitable experience appointed by the club (Approved Judge)

The NZGTA Graded Gundog Training Scheme

Introduction

Based on the UK Gundog club (see <u>http://www.thegundogclub.co.uk/?p=1034</u>) introduced in 2006 and still going strong

- Helps support struggling and novice or new gundog owners.
- Non-competitive (achievement based)
- Assessments done by different person to trainer.
- Assessments and training are <u>user paid.</u>
- Has been very popular with pet dog owners helping them control and enjoy their gundogs (many of their owners have had no previous contact with hunting, working gundogs or the trialing community)
- Great incentive for those in show world (especially breeders who will encourage their puppy owners to achieve qualifications on their pedigrees)
- Gives public credit to dogs that have won novice, limit, and open trials (presently a dog can win novice limit and even a challenge without any credit to the dog's ability or success)
- Will enable new (and current) members to the NZGTA achieve more success with their dogs both in natural game trialing and pigeon trials.
- Will reward dogs that achieve the various levels to be awarded a certificate and a title beside the dog's name on their pedigree. Novice Beginner Bronze (NBB), Novice Beginner Silver (NBS), Novice Beginner Gold(NBG), leading on to Field Trial Novice(FTN), Field Novice(FN) for winning out of Novice, Field Trial Novice Advanced (FTN adv.)for winning out of Limit, then Field Winner(FW) or Field trial winner(FTW), followed with the present FCH or FTCH, GFTCH and GFCH)

How it can be managed

- Individual Clubs who choose to use the training scheme will be responsible for managing training and assessment.
- Enrollment –we would suggest that students will pay a fee for training and assessment, this is an opportunity for clubs to generate some income.
- Students can attend classes.
 - At gundog clubs training days
 - At obedience clubs for lower grades
 - Self-managed -Students may choose to train themselves if they have guidelines to follow (training guides- currently in development)
 - Can be put with a mentor to discuss problems.
 - Use Skype, go-pros, movie app on most cell phones to communicate with Mentor

- Assessments run by clubs
 - This could be retired trial judges, senior handlers, anyone that has been in a competitive environment that the club deems proficient and suitable. Preferably independent of the training.
 - Can be done any time when student feels they are ready
 - Have assessment times at training days/fit it in at trials?
 - Have clear achievement guidelines for assessors (see the video links to see level achieved in UK)
 - Clear standards to be achieved must complete and pass each and every part of the test to be awarded the Grade.
